




Well Being Week

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Forgiveness Respect Justice Learning

Principal's Message

Good afternoon,

School Values

Our school Vision Statement reads: Our Lady of the Rosary School is a Catholic community where, as disciples of Jesus, we show respect, grow through learning, forgive others and act with justice.

Over the past few years, as a community, we have not focused so much on our core values, instead our focus has been on our school rules. While our school rule is extremely important, we should not lose sight of our values which give meaning and depth to our rule.

Our 4 values are of course are: Respect; Justice; Forgiveness and Learning. As a community, we will be reigniting an understanding of these values throughout the year and taking the time to reteach these values to our students.

Last week we commenced this through a focus on FORGIVENESS. As this is the season of Lent - a time to reflect on our lives and our relationship with God and others and to seek forgiveness for the times we have turned away from God or hurt others - we thought this was a wonderful opportunity to tie our faith to our values.

Nowhere in the Gospels does Jesus teach that forgiveness should be offered unconditionally. In Matthew, Jesus says that church members should forgive each other "seventy times seven times" (18:22), a number that symbolizes boundlessness.



Seeking forgiveness is a two part process, it requires us to be sorry for what we have done and it requires us to somehow ask to be forgiven, it also requires us to be able to forgive both ourselves and others when they seek forgiveness. However, asking for forgiveness is often a difficult action as it means that we have to own our behaviour and want to seek to reconnect to the person we have hurt. Often our stubbornness can get in the way of this both with our friends and with our God. I have seen many relationships destroyed, not because people are not sorry for their actions, but rather they cannot bring themselves to ask for forgiveness. As adults we need to explicitly teach this to our children and model to them how to seek forgiveness as well as how to forgive.

How do you ask God to forgive your sins?

Ask God to forgive you for what you've done. Just as you would with other people, after saying you are sorry you must ask to be forgiven. There is no special prayer you have to pray to earn forgiveness from God. All you have to do is ask him to forgive you, through Jesus Christ, and believe that he will forgive you



Nicky Gumbel once commented that, "the first to be sorry is the bravest, the first to forgive is the strongest and the first to forget is the happiest."

Are we ready to be brave, strong and happy?

Assistant Principal's Update hours each day that the school is open



8:55am-3:15pm each day

At the end of last year we were informed that OLR had one of the highest rates of absenteeism in the diocese. This year our goal was to halve the number of days absent across the school. So far at the half-way point of the term we have had a total of 433 days of lost learning due to student absences. This is almost double the same time last year.

It is a legal requirement, under the Education Act, that all school-age students attend school for the opening

hours each day that the school is open for learning, which for OLR means from 8:55am to 3:15pm each school day. We are also required to follow up absences, particularly those that are unexplained, so please send a note or use the school app to inform the class teachers.

We understand that children may be sick or have appointments from time to time and this will impact on their attendance at school. Many of the absences that we have seen this year have been due to holidays being taken during the early part of the term. Let's work together to support the learning of each student by having them present at school all day, every day.

Safety First: Please be aware that the carpark at the front of the school is for staff only between the hours of 7:45am and 4:00pm.

This means that there is no parking for parents during the busy drop

off and pick up times for the safety of the whole community. Last week there was a near miss with a car exiting the carpark

and the crossing guard, so please take extra care during these times.
