

Gonski 2.0

You have probably heard quite a lot about Gonski 2.0 that was published last week. In this report 3 priorities were expressed in in the recommendations for schooling in Australia.

- 1. Deliver at least one years growth in learning for every student every year.
- 2. Equip every child to be a creative, connected and engaged learner in a rapidly changing world.
- 3. Cultivate an adaptive, innovative and continuously improving education system.

To support these three priorities, the report also made recommendations across five areas to support them.

1.Laying the foundations for learning

- a. Promote high quality early learning and seamless transition into school
- b. Engage parents and carers as partners in their children's learning.
- c. Ensure all students have the opportunity within schools to be partners in their own learning.

2. Equipping every student to grow and succeed in a changing world

a. Introduce new reporting with a focus on learning attainment and learning gain

- b. Revise the structure of the Australian Curriculum to present the learning areas and general capabilities as learning progressions
- c. Prioritise the acquisition of foundation skills in literacy and numeracy in curriculum delivery in the early years
- d. Give more prominence to the acquisition of the general capabilities, eg critical and creative thinking, personal and social capabilities
- e. Review senior secondary school to equip students with skills for the future

3. Creating, supporting and valuing a profession of expert educators

- a. Create the culture and conditions to enable and encourage more professional collaboration, observation, feedback and mentoring amongst teachers
- b. Develop an online and on demand student assessment tool for teachers for the purpose of formative assessment and tailoring teaching
- c. Provide teachers with high quality professional learning
- d. Develop a comprehensive national teacher workforce strategy e. Implement effective induction
- strategies for early career teachers f. Create meaningful career pathways which value and utilise teaching expertise and keep excellent teachers teaching

4. Empowering and supporting school leaders

- a. Review and revise the Australian Professional Standards for Principals to prioritise leadership of learning and include accountability for individual student growth
- b. Ensure Principals have the autonomy required to lead their school on the improvement journey most relevant to their starting point
- c. Provide school leaders with high quality professional learning

5. Raising and achieving aspirations through innovation and continuous improvement

a. Enhance school and system internal review and external quality assurance processes for the purposes of monitoring and reviewing student learning gain

b. Accelerate the introduction of a Unique Student Identifier

c. Establish an independent institution to coordinate, source and generate the development of a national research and evidence base that can be easily accessed and implemented to improve student outcomes.

Having read through the <u>Executive Summary (available here</u>), I believe that schools in the Diocese of Broken Bay are already well on the journey to meeting many of these recommendations in Gonski 2.0, especially if you compare them to the <u>diocesan Learning Principles (available here</u>)


